It is becoming increasingly difficult to escape the consequences of man-made climate change as the effects are felt across the globe.

Just this year we witnessed the searing heat in Southern Europe and Canada with the resulting wildfires, floods and mass deaths in Libya and closer to home, record



heat in June followed by record rainfall in July. One can sometimes feel helpless in the face of the task ahead of us and feel that our individual actions will not make a difference. This is not the case.

Over the next number of months, I will outline the top tricks and tips to help you start the journey to a living more sustainable, healthy and happy lifestyle. Many of these tips will cost you absolutely nothing, and in some cases save you money! **Mark Lynch**

Church of Ireland's Environment Charter

As Christians we see the Earth and the natural environment as God's creation, something that needs to be both enjoyed and protected. The Church of Ireland recognises the importance of the stewardship of our environment both locally and nationally and has adopted the Environmental Charter, approved by General Synod in 2015, which calls on all parishes and parishioners to play their part by:

- Recognising and reducing waste.
- Increasing environmental awareness across parishes.
- Exercise leadership through environmental responsibility.
- Identifying spiritually and practically with the developing world.
- Influencing policy.

What is sustainability?

The traditional economic model is built on the produce, use, dispose of principal which is still prevalent today. Ever increasing consumption is encouraged to drive economic growth. This is not sustainable as we eventually run out of natural resources or the capacity of the planet to replenish them. World overshoot day calculates when we have used more from nature than the planet can replenish this year. The overshoot day in Ireland this year was the 21st April. This means that we would need 3.3 earths to provide the resources to continue consuming the way we currently do.

It would be hard to fathom how a Christian could disagree with the statement that we should "Meet the needs of the current generation without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs". This is the definition of sustainability as defined by the UN Brundtland Commission in 1987. Another way to phrase this is meeting our own needs, while protecting our children's future.

THE UN sustainable development goals were adopted in 2015 and is a vision and action plan to transform our world. There are 17 defined goals ranging from the elimination of poverty to gender equality, sustainable cities and communities to climate action, very much in the vein of Christian teaching.

What can I do?

Trying to figure out what you can do can be daunting. Will I have to make a substantial financial investment? Will I have to go vegan? Becoming more sustainable doesn't mean having to make drastic and life changing actions immediately. Every little action you can take will make a difference. In the next newsletter, I will explore the food we eat, its impact and small changes you can make to be more sustainable, and which can save you money too!

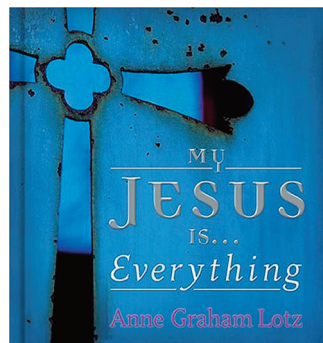


New in the Parish Library

She writes: *'Knowing Jesus is my joy and reason for living - the foundation on which I build, the Song in my heart, the Breath of my life - He is my All in all!'*

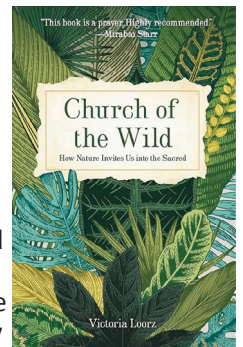
The library is in the Millennium Side Chapel, and details regarding borrowing books are above the bookshelf. JF
