In 1871 the anthropologist Edward B. Tylor described culture as 'the complex whole which includes knowledge, belief, art, law, morals, custom, and any other capabilities and habits acquired by man as a member of society.' But it omitted nature so in 1948 Melville J. Herskovits

described culture as 'the man-made part of the environment.' Religion and faith have hugely influenced culture over the centuries in seeking to shape our understanding of God, ourselves and all creation. Faith begs the question of the trustworthiness of the person or Divinity in whom it is placed. The dialogue, and sometimes tension, between culture and faith is constant.

One summary of this dialogue is found in the phrase those who are thankful (to God) and thinking as against those who are just thinking. On Culture Night, September 11th 2020, to mark the 150th anniversary of the Disestablishment of the Church of Ireland, every parish in the dioceses is asked to open wide the church doors and welcome the curious, the faithful, the searching, the whoever, into our sacred spaces to encourage conversations about faith and all it inspires in us and in those whose legacy is the beautiful buildings, music, prayers and ambience created by our faith culture.

A preparation for Culture Night workshop for 2 representatives from each parish is being held in Christ Church Cathedral on Friday 7th Feb from 11-1pm. Ideas on how best to promote our faith culture in

Rathfarnham on the 11th September are welcome, please.



Update

Following on from the questions and answers session on the 8th of December we are delighted to say that there has been significant interest in the project.

As previously outlined, the Vestry has proposed developing the planted area at the side of the Churchyard into a Remembrance Garden for the interment of ashes. The Vestry believe the Garden of Remembrance will be a very attractive addition to the Church grounds and will provide a quiet area for silent prayer and reflection where loved ones can be remembered. This is a costly project and therefore will need to be self-financing. This therefore requires commitment and payment from parishioners in advance of starting the project. In December we received payment to cover 50% of the costs which is a great start. We received just short of 30 expressions of interest on the 8th of December and others have since come forward. Therefore, while confident of achieving the funding this is a gentle reminder to anyone who intends to secure a right of burial in the Garden.
