




Dear Parishioners

We hope you enjoyed joining us for **Holy Week**, whether by popping in to the church for a few minutes of private prayer or attending our services online.





WLTD0?

Library Notes

We may not have access to the parish library at the moment but this book, *From Killing Fields to Fields of Life*, by Rev. Trevor Stevenson can be ordered online or from local book sellers.

His colleague Steve Stockman writes: *I learned what it is to follow Jesus one step at a time. I came to respect Trevor's openness to the leading of God and his courage to take the next step.*

Trevor had no grand plan or vision in 1993. Schools were not even on his radar. This memoir is a remarkable story of God's leading and a disciple listening and being courageous enough to follow.

Trevor and his wife Ruth, with financial help from their parish in Ireland, created a farm and then a school for local children in the bush lands that had once been the killing fields of Idi Amin in Uganda. Fields of Life was born and has grown with God's guidance. In six countries in East Africa, over 50,000 children attend 125 Fields of Life schools and over 770 wells provide fresh water.

Fields of life is now an International Development organization committed to sharing the Christian faith by working with local communities & churches in east Africa to bring about transformative changes in education, health and self-reliance.
