

The Meaning of the Memorial Garden Mosaic

The theme for the mosaic is Ecclesiastes 3:1 'There is a season for everything, a time for every matter under heaven'.

Images of leaves, flowers and fruit from different seasons are centred around an image of a Celtic cross, indicating that as spring follows winter so too life with Christ follows death.

This design arose from suggestions by **Gordon Wright** and the team who organised the construction of the Remembrance Garden.

The mosaic is made of stained glass, collected over the years from Ireland, UK, USA, France, Italy, and Germany.

The Celtic cross is based on a cross at **Clonmacnoise**; the gold pieces in its ring are from **Venice**.

The Tree of Life spreads its branches in front of the cross as in worship.

The same blue/brown glass is in the centre of the cross and the trunk of the tree symbolising that Christ is with us, sharing our life, in our joy and suffering.



The figures dancing in the water are pale and fragile compared with the strength of the cross on which we depend.

The autumn leaves, summer fruits and background around the Celtic cross are gilded with 24K gold to symbolise the light of Christ in our lives.

The mosaic is inserted into a roundel of **Wicklow** granite representing the Circle of Life.

I have found that in making a work of art based on a spiritual theme that you do not work alone; my constant prayer was 'God's hand to guide me'.


