I was also struck by lively and amplified birdsong when we visited the now partly ruined 13th century Collegiate church of St Mary's in Gowran. The birds have made the ruins their home, especially as the ruins are inaccessible to people. And hearing their song reverberating off walls and buttresses gave a further insight into the phrase 'living stones.' The church is still very much alive. Nature is proclaiming the glory of God. When the Pharisees wanted Jesus to silence his disciples because they were sharing the good news of God's presence on earth, Jesus replied "I tell you, if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out." (Luke 19:40). Every time our church doors open, we, the living stones and the church the literal stones have an opportunity to share our faith, our culture, our sacred space with seekers of information, of truth and of connection. Isn't that something to sing about??

World Day of Prayer 2020

'Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action' is an international, ecumenical Christian initiative that has it's roots in the self-help



and prayer groups set up by women in the United States after the devastation of the American Civil War.

Today the movement aims to bring together people of different races, cultures and Christian traditions in a common Day of Prayer written each year by the women of a different country. This years' service, *"Rise - take your mat and walk"* comes from Zimbabwe and will be hosted by Rathfarnham Parish on **Friday March 6th at 8pm.** The first service here in Ireland took place in 1934 and this year more than 200 services will be held across Ireland. The World Day of Prayer is celebrated in over 170 countries on the first Friday in March beginning in Tuvalu in the Pacific Ocean and moving around the world until the sun sets in Alaska. 

Dublin Outsiders. A History of the Mendicity Institution 1818-2018 by *Audrey Woods* with *Eimhin Walsh.* The Mendicity Institution (from the Latin for beggar) was founded in 1818 by a group of Dublin citizens who were deeply distressed by the way the city was failing so many of its people, men women and children, who were forced to beg on the streets in order to survive. It charts the evolution of their social mission over two hundred years. Today the Institution is a haven for many nationalities, offering them a place to go in the daytime, personal care and invaluable help and advice.

The Stars are Our Only Warmth - *Alice Leahy, a Memoir* with the journalist *Catherine Cleary.* This is the fascinating story of the life of Alice Leahy, her childhood, her early days in nursing and her tireless work as a fearless and outspoken advocate for the outsider in society, particularly the homeless. Her book is full of moving personal stories and it is a wonderful read.
