Toilet Twinning Initiative Flushed with Success! 👄

On Sundays March 10th and 17th Leo Shorten, a fifth form pupil from the High School, gave a short talk and video presentation on a charity called Toilet Twinning.



Every day, over 700 children under 5 die from diarrhoea linked to unsafe water, sanitation and poor hygiene. TT funds projects in communities that helps families to build their own basic toilet, access clean water and learn about hygiene - a vital combination that saves lives. Thanks to your generosity €790 was raised over the 2 Sundays - enough to twin all the Parish toilets in the Vestry, Parish Centre and the War Memorial Hall.

When the toilets are purchased we will receive certificates showing which toilet is twinned with which, a photograph of our overseas toilet twin and GPS coordinates so we can look up our twin's location on Google Maps! Thank you very much for your kindness. **LS**

our annual fête this year scheduled for 18th May.


