### The Way We Live

Our homes, and the things that we put into them, have a significant environmental impact on the environment.

The houses and buildings in which we live offer us an opportunity to take a look at where we can lower our environmental footprint, for example by reducing energy leakages or choosing sustainable build-



ing materials. Not only have we the opportunity to lower our environmental footprint, but the opportunity to live in more comfortable, efficient and sustainable homes.

The buildings in which we live and work account for 36 per cent of global final energy consumption and 37 per cent of energy related CO2 emissions. It is a substantial amount, but it provides the opportunity to have a significant impact in reducing these figures.

### **Reducing Energy Use**

The generation of heat (or cooling in warmer countries) consumes the largest amount of energy and thus reducing it will have the highest impact. The increased use of electrical appliances over the years such as TV's, phones and tablets has also increased household energy consumption in recent years. Here are few simple tips to reduce your energy use without spending a penny! And you could save yourself over 20% on your energy bills:


- Turn down the thermostat in living areas to 19 degrees.
- Lower the temperatures in hallways and landings to 15-18 degrees.
- Turn off the heat in rooms that you are not using.
- Wear warmer clothes indoors!

Of course, many of our homes were built in a time where energy efficiency was an alien concept. There has never been a better time to invest in upgrading your home with a plethora of grants available:

- VAT on domestic solar panels has been removed.
   Coupled with an SEAI grant of up to €2,400 a domestic solar installation can pay for itself in under 7 years and can also hedge against energy price fluctuations. And, you can now get paid for the excess energy you produce!
- Grants are available for attic and wall insulation, heating controls, heat pumps, window upgrades and home EV car charging points.
- In 2023, to bring an average Semi-D / End of Terrance with a BER rating from E1 to A2 cost €60,292 attracting a grant of €21,694 giving a nett cost of €38,598.
- For a detached house with a BER rating going from E1 to A2 cost €64,507 attracting a grant of €24,098 giving a nett cost of €40,408.
- Low interest green loans are availble for energy efficiency home improvements.
- One Stop Shop companies available who will look after the whole process for householders.

## **12** Tips To Save Energy At Home



### More Sustainability Actions for your Home

There are so many simple actions we can take to live more sustainably in our homes. Last month, I spoke in depth about food waste which has a huge environmental impact. Here are some top tips to make small changes which collectively can have a huge impact.

Wash at a cold temperature

Use solar powered devices

- 1. Be Water Wise: Just 0.4% of the Earth's water is freshwater, and far too much of that gets wasted every day. You can make a huge impact by reducing your water usage, taking shorter showers, fixing any leaky pipes around the house, or even sticking something heavy into your cistern to reduce the amount that gets flushed down the drain. Install a water butt to harvest rainwater for watering your plants.
- 2. Unplug Electronics: A surprisingly large amount of electricity is wasted by devices left plugged in. These devices continue to use power even when not in use, particularly TV's, phones and tablets. Make a habit of unplugging things that you don't use regularly. Top Tip: I use remote control sockets for device plugs that are hard to reach!
- 3. Have a Nature Friendly Garden: If you are lucky enough to have an open area, try to keep hard landscaping to a minimum. Plant pollinator friendly native plants and flowers. - 4. Avoid Unnecessary Plastics: Most of the yogurt cups, plastic cutlery, cosmetic packaging, shipping materials, coffee pods, and to-go containers that you've been dutifully placing in your recycling bin end up getting incinerated or sent to the landfill. Until this recycling deficit is addressed, the best option is to phase out your consumption of these plastics.
- 5. Know how to Recycle: Many goods are only as recyclable as what they're in the bin with. Broken glass or spilled sauces? To the landfill they go. And that oily, cheese-encrusted pizza box? Unusable unless you cut the contaminated portion off. For a guide on how to recycle visit https://repak.ie/recycling/what-can-i-recycle/

I wish you a very happy Christmas and New Year and leave you with this thought. The gift of Christmas is spending time with those you love and celebrating the birth of Jesus, not spending a small fortune buying unwanted or unneeded gifts!

We also thank **Zion Parish** for the loan of their tables, which saved us renting and helped keep the costs down.


Final totals are still being prepared, but it looks as though we raised approx €6,200 (with all the costs deducted.)
